KT was born and raised in the Highlands of Scotland, near Loch Ness. From an early age her fascination for nature and a love of drawing began the analysis of how plants, animals and insects were designed and constructed. Since discovering the amazing possibilities of glassmaking during her degree course at Farnham, KT has attempted to transfer her drawings into the third dimension using blown and solid hot sculpted glass. Most of the components are made separately, kept hot in a small kiln then attached to a body or bowl, using hot glass as "glue". KT has taught hot glass skills and designed for industry and now works as an independent glass artist, exhibiting internationally and working on commissions.

Course description:

This course offers beginners a chance to get some hands on experience with hot glass. Through demonstration students will be shown the basic principles of glass blowing; learning how to gather the molten glass, how to shape and form the glass into solid and blown forms, learn about colour and textures in glass and how to sand cast. We will make paper weights, beads, vases or sculptural objects. A day full of heat, lots of excitement and plenty of fun!

Materials will be provided. All work will be annealed over night and collected or sent at additional cost.

Please wear an old cotton long sleeved top and flat substantial shoes (no open toes! Ladies please no jewellery!).
